The Doctoral Day is designed primarily for students who are currently enrolled in the early to mid-stages of doctoral studies. It is an annual event which aims to create a space for exchange and dialogue between doctoral students, scientists and researchers on the one hand, and professionals and actors from the socio-economic world on the other hand in order to unveil behaviors and qualities of research leaders and managers. This meeting includes typology of knowledge and skills requirements and summarizes the gaps in knowledge and skills for improving effective research and innovation. Students will encouraged to submit posters for discussion and to present topics of their thesis to help them advance in their academic progress.

Proficiency of verbal communication is becoming more and more imperative for academic researchers. So this day is devoted to the PhD students to either present their own research to more experienced researchers. This is an opportunity to strengthen their dissemination skills, with more emphasis on the individual academics talents, through valuable experience in communicating their research.

The submission includes:

- 1. A registration form to fill out containing the main information about the participant
- 2. For first-year doctoral students: An abstract of 300 words containing the title of the thesis, the names of the authors (PhD student and thesis director(s)), address, e-mail and keywords
- 3. For 2nd year (or more) doctoral students, they can present some of their results: An abstract of 250 words containing the title, the names of the authors (PhD student in first position), address, e-mail and keywords
